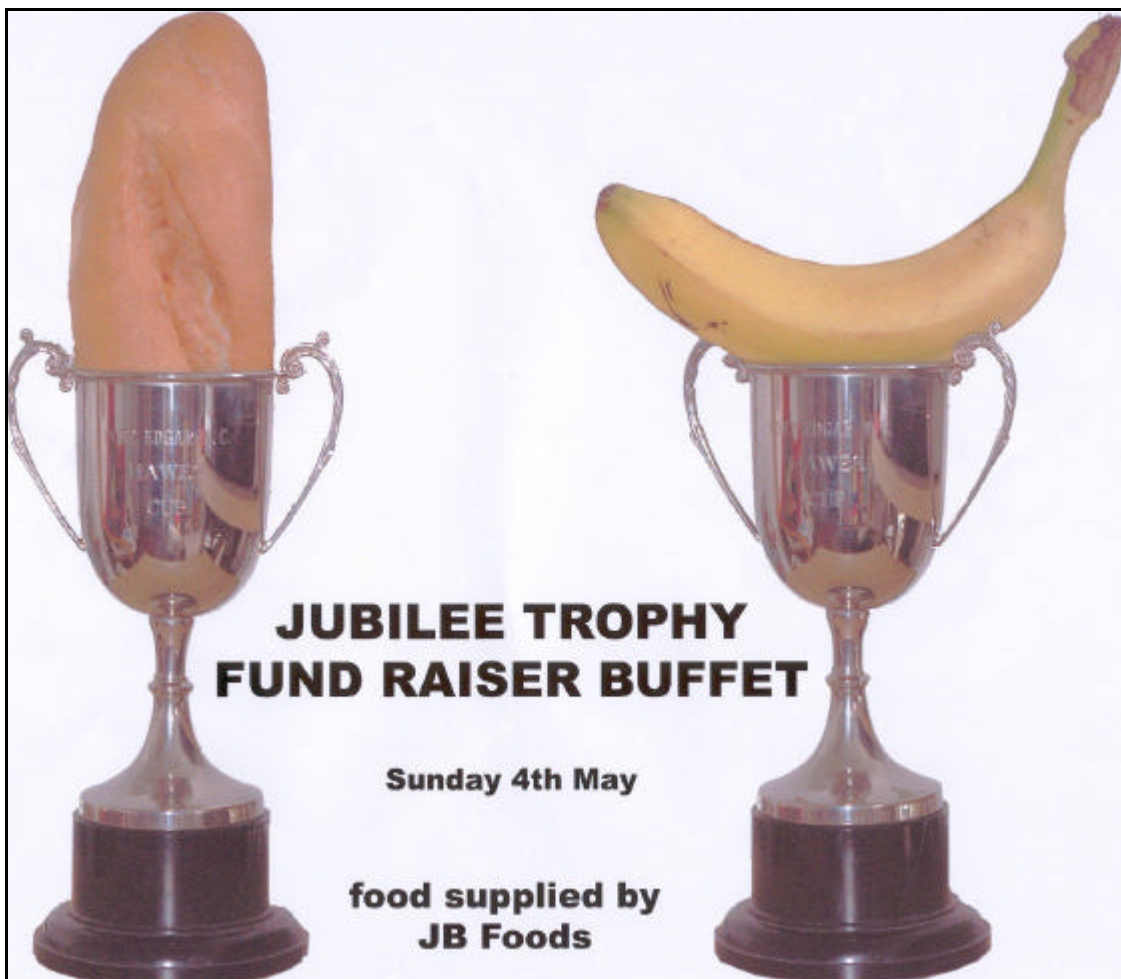
Jack and Christine Brown of JB Foods will be on hand to make sure the day is just tickety-boo.
