



 - Series results dual scoring on BH & RH
 - Club & RNLI trophy races
 - Revised mark layout & courses
 - Flashing light on Mark S for the Night courses



2023 Club Racing - Sun Yachts


- Racing most Sundays 2nd Apr 17th Dec
- AM race training if races start after 12:00
- Similar Sunday racing format as in 2022:
 - Pier starts, 'on-the-water' OODs & self timed finishes
 - Sun A & B series, normally starting at 14:00
 - Long-distance races (Bosun's Locker & Queen Margaret)
 - FCYC/RFYC Edinburgh Regatta on 17th 18th June
- Autumn 6-race & Winter 5-race series with CB starts



2023 Yacht Racing - Wind Limits


- Club should set wind limit guidance for OODs
- Applies principally to Pier Starts
- Use Forth Bridge website anemometer data





2023 Yacht Racing - Wind Limits

	Daylight Races							
Yacht (7m) Wind kt	Bridge (55m) Wind mph	Race Officer Guidance - Actions Before Start Sequence						
>18 kt	>25 mph	Display Y-flag & use VHF to announce that RRS 40 is in operation and lifejackets must be worn while racing.						
>25 kt	>34 mph	If a squall occurs that should pass through, display flag AP to postpone the start until the wind drops to <25 kt. Explain delay on VHF.						
>30 kt	>41 mph	Before yachts leave their berths, display flag AP to postpone start & use VHF to advise yachts to stay in marina until wind is <25 kt. Extend the time between AP removal & 1st warning signal to give crews time to rig and reach the start line.						



2023 Yacht Racing - Wind Limits

	Twilight & Night Series Races								
Yacht (7m) Wind kt	Bridge (55m) Wind mph	Race Officer Guidance - Actions Before Start Sequence							
>18 kt	>25 mph	Declare race will be under Restricted Sail rules. No spinnakers or gennakers may be set.							
>20 kt	>28 mph	If a squall occurs that should pass through, display flag AP to postpone the start until the wind drops to <20 kt. Explain delay on VHF.							
>25 kt	>34 mph	Before yachts leave their berths, display flag AP to postpone start & use VHF to advise yachts to stay in marina until wind is <20 kt. Extend the time between AP removal & 1st warning signal to give crews time to rig and reach the start line.




PEYC Accounts – Year ending 31 Oct 2022

- Rob Meredith will inspect our draft Accounts as he did last year
- The club made a profit of £8,832
 - Inflated by the final grant payment from Sport Scotland of £7,618
- Cash flow was negative £32,548
 - Primarily due to final clubhouse payments totalling £45,216
- Cash flow forecast for this current financial year is £10,000 to £17,500 positive based on a set of pessimistic / optimistic assumptions
- The coffee machine is making a strong contribution -
 - The machine cost £3,997 and should pay for itself in about 3 years.
- 707 events are profitable approx £1,500 £2,000 per event
- The bar made a profit of £5,625 on turnover of £10,084

SUBSCRIPTIONS 2023

- The club trades at a profit & generates significant cash from normal operations.
- We have used up most of our cash savings on assets:the new clubhouse, new cruising boat 'Nimrod', and
 new committee boat 'Beamer'.
- Our cash balance will consequently be very low prior to receipt of our annual subscriptions on 31st March.
- We need to build up our cash savings again.
 Modest subscription increases are proposed this year.
