RULES

The event will be governed by the 'Rules' as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) 2017 - 2020, RYA Prescriptions and class regulations, except as amended or added to by the regatta sailing instructions.

VENUE

Racing will be held at Port Edgar, South Queensferry EH30 9SQ.

DATE

Saturday Sunday 12 - 13th May 2018

ELIGIBILITY

The regatta is open to all dinghies. An individual class is planned for the RS200, RS400, and Feva for both days. There will be a class for Quests and a handicap class on Sunday May 13th.

RISK STATEMENT

Rule 4 of the Racing Rules of Sailing states that: The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone. Sailing is by its nature an unpredictable sport and therefore inherently involves an element of risk. By taking part in the event, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that:

- (i) They are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and accept responsibility for the exposure of themselves, their crew and their boat to such inherent risk whilst taking part in the event;
- (ii) They are responsible for the safety of themselves, their crew, their boat and their other Property whether afloat or ashore;
- (iii) They accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions or omissions;
- (iv) Their boat is in good order, equipped to sail in the event and they are fit to participate;
- (v) The provision of a race management team, race committee boats, etc, does not Relieve them of their own responsibilities;
- (vi) It is their responsibility to familiarise themselves with any risks specific to this venue or this event drawn to their attention in any rules and information produced for the venue or event and to attend any safety briefing held for the event.
